The colloquium aims to provide a platform for the students, researchers and academicians to share the knowledge and ideas on recent trends in the field of technology and management on the issues and challenges presently faced in the networking folklore particularly in the prevailing pandemic scenario that has given quantum jump to the flow of information and social networking. Moreover, the economic and political issues in the international level also provided a boost to the phenomenon of information flow and accordingly created various sentiments and moods in the social network environment. Therefore, the objective to hold this colloquium on information flux is to connect the stakeholders and identify trends on how

information is shaping the society and how abundance of information is making an impact on societal resilience.

To spearhead on the above objectives, the colloquium has been divided into four themes that revolve around the various tracks such that each key theme throws light on various dimensions of use and misuse of information technology and how its management and optimization of information strike in such a way that it becomes the driver of concord rather than an inspiration for conflicts and unrest in the overall environment.

TRACKS & THEMES:-

Track 1: Information Technology and its Management

- ◆ Data Science and its Applications (Artificial Intelligence, Machine Learning, Deep Learning, etc.)
- ◆ Information Technology for COVID-19 Management
- ◆ Real Life Applications

Track 2: Information Security

- ◆ Information Warfare
- ◆ Changing Landscape of Cyber Risk
- ◆ Cyber Resilience and Societal change

Track 3: Virtual Presence and Social Distancing

- ◆ Psychological Behavior
- ◆ Emotional Intelligence
- ◆ Impact of Pandemic

Track 4: Information Analysis, its impact and Management

- ◆ Group behaviour and crowd management
- ◆ Social Media Information Management
- ◆ Information Authenticity and moderation

Each theme title will begin with the deliberation made by the subject expert followed by a maximum of 03 virtual presentations submitted by the participants. The best three papers would be the ones chosen by the respective moderator out of the total submission in the given theme track. The selected participants will be given 10 minutes each to present their research. Each track will have two invited speakers who will be giving their lecture for 30 minutes each. Moreover, 10 minutes is being kept for discussion. The track chairs will moderate and coordinate their sessions. Therefore, each track will be of 100 minutes, approximately.

Tentative Topics mentioned are preferable but not exhaustive. Research articles and inputs in any of the above themes and sub-themes are welcome. Those registering in the colloquium will be given an E-Certificate of participation while those who would be presenting will be given participation cum presentation E-certificates. We are also planning to publish all the extended abstracts online.

MODE OF VIRTUAL PRESENTATION

The colloquium will have a participatory approach that would comprise a mixture of methods including presentations by subject matter experts and researchers followed by discussion and brainstorming sessions. The complete process will be in online mode. Moreover, the presentations can be developed from multiple viewpoints using a mixture of vernacular languages to promote open discussions without language limitations and linguistic barriers. Due to the restrictions imposed by the Government in the light of the outbreak of COVID-19, the colloquium will be conducted via online mode.
